We pray for all doctors and nurses, who are committed to upholding all life in the womb. We thank you for the great knowledge of the processes of life and the skills you have revealed to them. We pray for all those doctors and nurses, who in the name of women's freedom are prepared to destroy life in the womb. Give to them a true fear of God. Open the eyes of their hearts and minds, we pray O God, that they may repent of being agents of death even in the presence of new life. We ask all of these prayers in the name of Jesus Christ our LORD. Amen.

Day 2 – Birth

Leader: In the Name of the Father + Son and Holy Spirit. Amen. Our Father...

Leader: "And she gave birth to her first born son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the Inn" Luke 2:7

Leader: Let us pray.

Father in Heaven, we thank you for the gift of life in the womb. May we all venerate it for the miracle that it is.

We thank you for all who, like Mary, will give birth this day. Grant them all safe delivery, a minimum of pain, and the support of doctors, nurses, midwives, spouses and family members.

We pray for all whose delivery is complicated. Grant wisdom to all who attend them and empower them through their ordeal. Give them a sense of your loving presence, a presence that drives out all fear.

Father, our hearts aches for all those whose infant lives are terminated this day in pain and anguish. Thank you that they too are on an endless journey that cannot be terminated by human actions. May they joyfully enter the family of the holy innocents and find there forgiveness and compassion for all those who denied them life on earth. Grant them a joyful reunion with their mothers one day. We ask all these prayers in the name of Jesus Christ our LORD. Amen.

Day 3 – Infancy and Childhood

Leader: In the Name of the Father + Son and Holy Spirit. Amen. Our Father...

Leader: "The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom and the favour of God was upon him." Luke 2:40

Leader: Let us pray.

God and Father of our Lord, Jesus Christ, grant to all babies and children the grace to increase in wisdom and in years and in divine and human favour. Bless, we pray all families. May they find in the Holy Family an example and inspiration for true parenting. Bless their homes that loving wisdom and discipline may flourish, each young life loved and valued in their uniqueness.

Grant Father, to single parents, special grace to raise their children single handedly, and the support they need through grandparents and through the church and their communities. Expose we pray all abuse of children by members of their families, or persons in authority. Grant wisdom and vigilance to all teachers, child care-givers and social workers. Day 4 – Youth and Coming of Age

Leader: Jesus said to them; "Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" Luke 2:49

Leader: Let us pray.

We pray for all young people seeking their identity including their sexual identity and their eternal destiny. By God's holy protection, may none stir up or awaken love until it is ready (Song of Songs 2:7). Grant protection over them that they may be able to stand against the wiles of the Devil, including the lure of casual sex, addictive substances, abortion.

Send forth Christian witnesses as labourers in this great harvest of souls, that each young person may know they have been chosen in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before Him in love. Give wisdom, patience and forgiving love to parents, teachers, counselors in challenging times.

Bless we pray, the catechism classes in all our parish communities and all confirmation preparations, that the power and love of the Holy Spirit may be poured into each young heart. May our bishops, priests and deacons, women religious and lay pastoral ministers be shining examples to our young people as they faithfully minister word and sacrament.

And we pray for all who seek to bring back into the fold of community life, those young people who have gone astray – for all police officers, youth workers, addiction councilors, prison officers. Give to them your compassion, O God as they perform the office of Good Shepherds. We ask these prayers through our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

Day 5– Working People

Leader: Jesus answered them "My Father is still working, and I also am working." John 5:17

Leader: Let us pray.

Father, thank you that you are always at work making all things new and that your son, the carpenter of Nazareth and the inaugurator of your Kingdom on earth continues your work.

Day 6 – Marriage, Parenting and Family Life

Leader: In the Name of the Father + Son and Holy Spirit. Amen. Our Father...

Leader: "Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved his church and gave himself up for her. Wives, be subject to your husbands as you are to the Lord. Children, obey your parents in the Lord for this is right. Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger." Ephesians 5: 22-24

Leader: Let us pray.

Father in Heaven. In the Holy Family, you provided for your Son here on earth. You also gave to us an example of how spouses and children can live together in loving sacrifice and service. pour out your Holy Spirit upon all husbands and wives and children that they may live together in harmony in the midst of all of the pressures of modern living. May they be careful how to live, not as unwise people but as wise, making the most of their time together, because the days are evil. We pray especially for those marriage relationships where love has grown cold and frequent quarreling occurs. Shield your children who live amongst anger and hatred. Help them to forgive their parents.

Provide loving support for those relationships that are stressed through the care of family and friends and councilors. May the blood and water flowing from the pierced heart of Jesus heal, restore and reconcile these relationships. And Father, we pray for the divorced and separated. Give them hope and comfort that comes from knowing that you hold them in your care and will continue to unfold your loving purposes for their lives. We pray for those in your church who are approaching retirement or are already retired, who are no longer parenting and find themselves with time on their hands. May they cry out to you to fulfill your purposes for them in their lives. We pray for all service organizations in your church. Knights of Columbus, Catholic Womens League, St. Vincent de Paul Society, Kanes Kitchen, that they may fruitfully channel this desire to sacrifice and serve your people, especially the poor, sick and the needy. Prosper their work and inspire their members, we pray.

And we ask these prayers in the all prevailing name of your Son, our LORD, Jesus Christ. Amen.
