



Introduction to this Sunday's Liturgy:

In ancient times, when people contracted leprosy they were immediately excluded from the community, barred from contact with anyone else. But Jesus changed all that when a single leper came to him. Not only did he heal him, he did so by reaching out and touching him, breaking down the barrier between healthy and sick, between "clean" and "unclean." As Jesus did, so did Paul, the apostle to the Gentiles, who wrote that he became an imitator of Christ. May the words we hear today inspire us to be imitators of Christ as well, breaking down barriers and reaching out to those who have been excluded.

Year of Prayer:

Year of Prayer was announced in January by our Holy Father: The coming months will lead us to the opening of the Holy Door, with which we will begin the Jubilee. I ask you to intensify your prayer to prepare us to live well this event of grace, and to experience the strength of God's hope. Therefore, today we begin the Year of Prayer; that is, a year dedicated to rediscovering the great value and absolute need for prayer in personal life, in the life of the Church, and in the world. Please come to our various devotions for prayer like Rosary, Adoration, Intercessory Prayer and other prayer groups.

(Feb 11) World Day of the Sick has been designated this Sunday since 1992 by Saint John Paul II. A few weeks ago Pope Francis offered a message for the 32nd Word Day of the Sick entitled: "It is not good that man should be alone": Healing the Sick by Healing Relationships.
