

CONFORMANCE:

The archbishop of our diocese, Most Reverend Brian Dunn has reached out to all parishes regarding changes in the celebration of our liturgy. As the "moderator, promoter, and guardian" of the liturgical life of the diocese he is looking to review our liturgy and ensure that appropriate 'norms' are being followed as we celebrate the Eucharist. The main reason for addressing these 'norms' is to ensure consistency throughout the Archdiocese, enabling parishioners to be comfortable and confident that all Masses will be celebrated in the same manner, no matter which church you choose to attend.

What does this mean for Immaculate Conception and our family of churches? Beginning in the Lenten season we will introduce these minor changes to our current practices. To help, these changes will be implemented with an explanation and appropriate prompts during the Mass.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

<u>Parish Life Survey</u>: Our goal is to understand our parishioners' experience of worship and parish community life, and to identify the strengths, needs, and opportunities for growth in our parish, so we can better serve our God and our parishioners.

Introduction to this Sunday's Liturgy:

Christmas is over but remaining with us always is the greatest Christmas gift ever—the Son of God. Moses told the people that one day God would send a prophet from among their descendants who would speak God's word with authority. We believe that this promise is fulfilled in Jesus, who in the Gospel speaks God's word with such authority that even the unclean spirits obey him! We may be anxious about many things, to use Saint Paul's words, but let the knowledge that God is with us and that He alone can dispel the darkness in our lives and give us hope.

Ash Wednesday:

Ash Wednesday, *February 14th* marks the beginning of Lent, an unusual and sweet Valentines gift of invitation for our family and friends. It is a season of reflection on one's transgressions, fasting, abstinence from meat, and repentance; all of which prepares us for Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday. It is generally inappropriate to dine out, to shop, or to go about in public after receiving the ashes. Feasting is highly inappropriate. Small children, the elderly and sick are exempt from this observance. The ashes symbolize our penance made sacramental by the blessing of the Church, and they help us develop a spirit of humility and sacrifice. Please join us at any of the scheduled celebrations.
