Introduction to this Sunday's Liturgy:

As we draw close to Holy Week, we hear Jesus talk about his approaching death. Yet his message to his disciples is not so much about his death as it is about eternal life. As Christians, we know that as difficult as death is, our true focus, our true hope is in eternal life, trusting that our Lord is our source of eternal salvation. During this final week before Holy Week, let us keep in mind that just as our Lenten journey will not end with Good Friday, but with Easter, so too does our own life's journey end not in death but in new life.

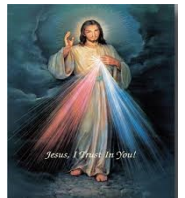

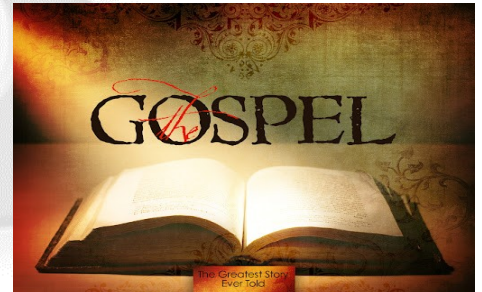
Easter Vigil:

(20 Mar) The Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Truro Conference will hold its Regular Monthly meeting in Campbell Hall, on **Wednesday, March 20th**, following Mass, at 7:30 pm. New members are welcome to attend.

(March 26) All in our diocese are invited to our noon hour Chrism Mass and Blessing of Holy Oils. We're planning for a good turn out from our parish so we've rented a bus for travel to and from Immaculate Conception Church and St Mary's Cathedral Basilica where this significant celebration takes place. Conscience Protection for Nova Scotia Doctors

Imagine a healthcare system where death is considered a therapeutic treatment. *Imagine being a Christian doctor in that system.* Imagine being told by your medical regulator that you are abandoning your patient if you don't make arrangements for them to get an assessment for euthanasia. That healthcare system is in Nova Scotia today. The Nova Scotia medical regulator is pushing through a policy that would force physicians to refer patients for euthanasia, abortion, and transgender services. *Twenty-three courageous Christian physicians* have told Nova Scotia's medical regulator that they cannot abide by this new draft policy

When they are at their most vulnerable, people may choose euthanasia if they don't have suitable options to live. We need physicians who will go the extra mile to ensure their patients are connected with the supports and services they need. Nova Scotia's physicians are too important to patient care to be sacrificed for the sake of an unnecessary policy.

We need your help! On Friday March 22, 2024, the NS medical regulator plans to pass a policy that would force NS physicians to participate by way of a referral in euthanasia, abortion, and transgender services against their conscience. Twenty-three NS physicians have already signed letters saying that they cannot abide by this policy. The regulator has indicated that if there is a complaint against a physician for not following this policy, they will be disciplined and may lose their license. All of these services are currently available without a referral.
