

Introduction to this Sunday's Liturgy:

"I am the vine, you are the branches," we hear Jesus tell his disciples in today's Gospel. We are those branches now. Connected to the vine that is the Lord, we are expected to bear fruit. In the first reading, we catch a glimpse of Saint Paul (still called Saul) at a unique time. Just recently converted, he is intent on bearing fruit by speaking boldly in Jesus' name. John tells us that believing in Jesus' name and loving one another are the ways to remain in him, attached to the vine. These passages are assuring them, and us, that we will bear fruit abundantly. Let us hear how we can become such disciples.

CURSILLO?

The Cursillo Movement proposes no new type of spirituality, but simply a method by which one's spirituality may be developed, lived and shared.

The Holy Father, Pope Paul VI has given his approval to the Cursillo Movement. In December 1963 he approved the Movement, appointing St. Paul as the official patron and protector of the Cursillo.

Cursillo (pronounced Kur-see-yo) is a Spanish word, meaning short course or little course. It begins Thursday evening and ends the following Sunday afternoon.

During those three days the people attending live, work and pray together; they also attend Mass and receive Communion.

Your Cursillo can be made only once in a lifetime, therefore it is not a substitute for a retreat. The basic atmosphere of a Cursillo differs greatly from the individual solitude of a retreat. During the three days, teachings of Christ are discussed in a climate of joy, with many singing and joke sessions.

A Cursillo is an encounter with Christ. That sounds too simple, but it is not. Think about it. A real meeting with Christ. If that is understood, then the power, beauty and joy of the Cursillo will be understood. Interested? Attend one!

The goal of the Cursillo Movement is that Christ be the prime influence in society. So it is said that the PRIMARY OBJECTIVE of the Cursillo Movement is to develop in adult Christians a consciousness of their mission to become leaders in the work of Christian renewal.

The time for an Easter pilgrimage has passed and the Harvest Festival aligns with our pilgrimage to our Congress, therefore, we wish to introduce a Pentecost pilgrimage in our own parish on *Thursday, May 16*. There we'll have adoration from 10:00 am to evening Mass, and end with 8:00 pm Benediction, as usual. Our hope next year is to schedule additional pilgrimages for ourselves, and in all our Churches.
