

1. Sign up for the WAIT LIST even though the Congress is SOLD OUT!

Thank you! Over 600 people have registered for the Congress. As the arch diocese determines whether more spaces can be added, they have enabled a waitlist function to their registration system. Go to www.halifaxyarmouth.org and click on waitlist at the bottom of the registration page to add your name. If space opens you will then be notified.

- **2. Livestreaming the Congress** The Congress will be livestreamed in full on Friday evening (Oct 18). Immaculate Conception will host a live streaming event in Campbell Hall. The livestream schedule for the rest of the Congress will be decided shortly and shared.
- 3. Use Metro Transit for Free!

Metro Transit approved the use of our Congress lanyard name badge to access Metro Transit buses and ferries for **FREE** for the duration of the Congress. So from October 18 to October 20 everyone registered for the Congress can ride Metro Transit for free! For example, those not able to do the procession can hop on the 1 Spring Garden bus at the stop in front of Saint Agnes which will bring them to a bus stop in front of Saint Mary's Cathedral Basilica in approximately 10 mins. The bus cost is heavily subsidized at \$15.00 return fare, plus \$10 for the Congress Day Pass.

As you're aware, the number of Nova Scotians unable to access a family doctor exceeds 160,000. This figure could rapidly escalate by up to 40,000 people following the <u>implementation</u> of a new policy established by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Nova Scotia.

In its new policy, the College requires that physicians offer Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) to patients even before they request it, and make arrangements for the patient to be assessed via referral. This forces doctors to be involved in a medical procedure they believe is not in the best interests of their patients and runs contrary to their moral and ethical convictions. Nova Scotia Health provides access to these services without a referral.

Meanwhile, 8 jurisdictions in Canada have found a solution. The college refuses to meet with these concerned doctors. The college will not consider alternatives without the political support of MLA's.

If changes are not made to the College's policy, at least 42 physicians across the province – in both rural and urban areas – are at risk of being disciplined by the College, which could cause some to leave the province or retire early. The result of this is a loss of healthcare for Nova Scotians

Please don't let that happen. I am asking you to please meet with these physicians and find a workable solution to this problem. Please ask the premier to make this his top priority. I want to have a doctor who is committed to provide care in the best interests of patients and not be forced to unquestioningly adhere to a policy.
