





(Jan 22 & 29) Dying with Christ, Living with Hope Sessions The Christian Medical and Dental Association of Canada (CMDA) has announced dates for their next session ● January 15, 22, & 29 at 7 PM ET ● February 20, 27, & March 6 at 12 PM ET. This program presents a hope-filled perspective on a universal experience. Led by theologians and healthcare professionals, the series explores timeless insights into suffering, grief, dying, the duty to care, and how dying with Christ is attainable for everyone. (Feb1) First Saturday Mass, Rosary and Devotions at 9 am in ICC. Why the First Saturday? Because Our Lady through Sister Lucia at Fatima calls us to pray in Communion and Reparation to her Immaculate Heart for peace and the salvation of souls and Jesus confirms this call. First Saturday pamphlets are available at our church entrances.

(Feb 2-8) National Catholic Healthcare Week: While in our Archdiocese there are no Catholic health care facilities, there are many Catholic healthcare workers. We want to recognize that their faith impacts the work they do. Let us pray for them in particular during this Week. The Catholic Health Alliance of Canada (visit https://www.chac.ca/en/) has produced resources for individuals, groups, and parishes to highlight this national week. The 2025 theme "Caring for our Common Home" celebrates the interconnectedness of all creation and helps us to reflect on how our individual and collective actions and our systems—health, social, economic—can promote a healthy world where all can thrive.

(Feb 3) Saint Blaise Blessing of Throats. He was the bishop of Sebastea and a doctor in the fourth century. The first known record of the saint's life comes from the medical writings of Aëtius Amidenus, where he is recorded as helping with patients suffering from objects stuck in their throat. Saint Blaise is believed to begin as a healer then, eventually, became a "physician of souls." He then retired to a cave, where he remained in prayer. People often turned to Saint Blaise for healing miracles. Many of the miraculous aspects of St. Blaise's life are written of 400 years after his martyrdom in the "Acts of St. Blaise." We will recognize this Saint and offer a blessing of throats at 7pm Mass on Monday, February 3.
