

Introduction to this Sunday's Liturgy

We begin the holiest week of the year by holding palm branches in our hands, which recall the palm branches the crowds used two thousand years ago to welcome the Lord into the holy city. Our palm branches are blessed, for they also welcome the Lord to this holy place. Though the people of Jerusalem had no idea what the true nature of Jesus' triumph would soon be, we do and so we anticipate Jesus' ultimate victory while recognizing the intense suffering and profound grief that will accompany it. Let us raise our voices along with our branches as we sing out as even the stones will, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!"

<u>Holy Week is April 13 to 20</u> . It begins on Palm Sunday with our regular weekend Mass schedule. The remaining Holy Week has celebrations scheduled at each of our churches and at our Cathedral. This is the most holy time of year for Christians. Our participation in this week, preceded by our Lenten practices, well prepare us for the glorious celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus. For those with sensitivities please note that incense will be used at our significant celebrations of Holy Thursday and Easter Vigi l.

Bells for Holy Thursday and Easter Vigil Bring your bell with you to ring loudly as we reintroduce the Gloria into our Liturgy. While the Last Supper otherwise still carries a somber mood, it anticipates the resurrection and the feeding of many. Then we are in full glorious celebration mode at the Vigil.		
Easter Vigil is our highest liturgy of the year and we urge your presence at this glorious celebration. We'll hear God's plan of salvation unfold in four readings from the Old Testament along with their associated and sung psalms from the Kingdom of David. We'll hear the climatic Gospel of the Resurrection. With the Eucharist prayers we make the very same Savior, Jesus the Christ, present among us and celebrate the initiation of new members into our Catholic family. To aid participation in our celebration we'll use our projection screen for our hymns and prayers while we make known the four Rites as they're celebrated. Come let us celebrate this most holy of nights together.
