

<u>Holy Rosary</u> May is a month we traditionally honor our Blessed Mother. Please ask for her intercession by praying the Rosary individually, in our families or in our church. In our churches, all are welcome to join us at any of the following times before the regularly scheduled Masses:

- Saturday at 3:30pm at St Michael
- Sunday at 9:45am at St Kateri



<u>Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament</u>: Thursdays from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm and after the 7:00 pm Mass, ending with 8:00 pm Benediction.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: 30 mins prior to weekday Masses or by appointment.

All the Faithful Called to Pray for Conclave While we may have a new Pope by Sunday, we are invited to pray for the Conclave and for the new Pope. The Conclave (from the Latin cum clavis, meaning "with key") began Wednesday May 7th with 133 Cardinals from across the world to elect a new Pope. This time, which mirrors the time spent by the disciples in the Upper Room awaiting the Holy Spirit, is marked by constant prayer and discernment for God's will. However, it's not just up to the Cardinals to pray. All the faithful are invited to invoke the Holy Spirit "so that we may elect a worthy pastor of the entire flock of Christ." Therefore, please add the Cardinals, the new Pope, and the whole church to your prayers in the coming days.

(May 22) A Halifax March for Life is organized by Campaign Life Coalition Nova Scotia (CLC NS) on May 22. At 1 PM, Marchers will walk from the meeting point of St. Mary's Cathedral on Spring Garden Rd. to outside Province House where we will peacefully witness to the dignity and humanity of preborn children and pray for an end to abortion For those 29 and under, they are also hosting a Pro-Life Youth Summit that morning from 10:00-12:00, with lunch provided afterwards, and culminating in the March for Life. The event will be focused on the role of social media in the pro-life movement, and how to approach men and women who have a history with abortion. Their guest speakers are Shania Fernandes.

(May 24) Traditional Latin Mass will be celebrated at St Agnus Church, 6903 Mumford Rd. Halifax. The Mass is at 1030am am on Saturday, May 24 with Fr John Kodet, FSSP. All are invited to experience this form of Mass used until Vatican II in the 1960's. It's also referred to as the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite, or as the Tridentine Mass, being codified by the Council of Trent in 1570. This older Roman Rite was superseded by our current Rite, Ordinary Form (Novus Ordo) which uses modern languages. Note, that being a Saturday morning celebration, it is not considered as a replacement for our regular Sunday Mass obligation.

(May 25) SANTACRUZAN and FLORES de MAYO. In its second year, a Filipino Catholic tradition will be celebrated at Immaculate Conception Church on Sunday May 25, 2025 with a 3:00 pm rosary, 4:00pm mass and Santacruzan street procession followed by a "Salo-Salo", an evening potluck meal of traditional Filipino food.
