

Parish Jubilees 2025 Please see the linked 10-minute video which explains the upcoming Parish Jubilees in the Fall of 2025: https://youtu.be/l4HTVgwYKIA Diocesan and parish Jubilees in the fall of 2025 are from September through December, parishes will host four Jubilee events, each focused on one of the diocese's pastoral priorities: Catechesis (September 21), Evangelization (October 19), Social Justice (November 16), and Liturgy (December 7). These dates may be adjusted slightly to accommodate the needs of individual parishes. Each event will include liturgical elements such as blessings and commissioning for those involved in ministries related to that month's theme. In addition, parishes will gather for reflection through video presentations and other materials developed collaboratively by the diocese and the local parish community.

<u>Nave Alterations.</u> In 2021, sanctuary and stained glass enhancements were completed at Immaculate Conception Church. We are now considering additional changes, though comparatively minor in cost, to the walls around the nave (pew area). The objectives include improving access to the church, increasing reverence and reducing noise before Mass, increasing opportunities for adoration prayer, relocating the Nativity scene, and enhancing the screen wall. These proposed alterations will be presented in September. Such

enhancements are in keeping with the urging of recent Popes to make our churches more appealing to those seeking. What are they seeking? They are seeking the reverence and ancientness of the church, its consistency in rituals and biblical teaching, a hospitable faith community and a place to heal, as in a spiritual hospital Pope Francis spoke of. Benedict XVI spoke in Poland that in a world where there is so much noise, so much bewilderment, there is a need for silent adoration of Jesus concealed in the Host. Pope Leo XIV has emphasized the importance of an "open" and "missionary" church, calling for unity and reconciliation within the Catholic Church and beyond.
