



### Introduction to this Sunday's Liturgy

By his crucifixion, Jesus transformed the cross from a profane instrument of execution to a symbol of triumph. Jesus sanctified the cross, making it holy, by sacrificing his life to win our salvation. We exalt the holy cross in a special way today, but we also exalt it every time we make the sign of the cross to express and bear witness to our faith. May the cross be a sign for us of Christ's power to overcome death and give new life.

(Sep 27) St Michael the Archangel, one of our patrons, Feast day is September 29. It'll be celebrated in Brule with a reception following the 4 pm Mass on Saturday, 27th. The name Michael signifies "who is like to God?" And was the war cry of the good angels in the battle fought in heaven against Satan and his followers. Holy Scripture describes St. Michael as "one of the chief princes" and as leader of the forces of heaven in their triumph over the powers of hell. He has been especially invoked and honored as Patron and Protector by the Church from the time of the Apostles. Although he is always called "the Archangel" the Greek Fathers and many others placed him over all the angels - as Prince of the Seraphim.

(Sep 30) National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, a federal statutory holiday, provides us with a chance to recognize and commemorate the intergenerational harm that residential schools have caused to Indigenous families and communities, and to honour those who have been affected by injustices.
