



Introduction to this Sunday's Liturgy

"You cannot serve both God and man," we hear Jesus tell his disciples in today's Gospel. He challenges us to decide where our priorities lie. It is difficult to ignore the need for money, if only to have enough to get by, let alone pursuing more so that we can live a comfortable life. But we believe our treasure can be found in the kingdom of God, in which money is irrelevant. May today's liturgy remind us of that truth.

ANNOUNCEMENTS CALENDAR:

(Sep 27) St Michael the Archangel, one of our patrons, Feast day is September 29. It'll be celebrated in Brule with a reception following the 4 pm Mass on Saturday, 27th. The name Michael signifies "who is like to God?" And was the war cry of the good angels in the battle fought in heaven against Satan and his followers. Holy Scripture describes St. Michael as "one of the chief princes" and as leader of the forces of heaven in their triumph over the powers of hell. He has been especially invoked and honored as Patron and Protector by the Church from the time of the Apostles. Although he is always called "the Archangel" the Greek Fathers and many others placed him over all the angels - as Prince of the Seraphim.

(Sep 30) National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, a federal statutory holiday, provides us with a chance to recognize and commemorate the intergenerational harm that residential schools have caused to Indigenous families and communities, and to honour those who have been affected by injustices. At our normally scheduled 12:15 pm Tuesday, 30th Mass we'll make special mention and offer prayers of reparation and also thanksgiving that our Lord brings goodness from difficulty.
